

NAGESWARAR TEMPLE, AMBUR, THIRUPATTUR

Nageswarar Temple is a Hindu, Temple dedicated to Lord Shiva located in the heart of Ambur Town in Thirupattur District of Tamil Nadu. This Temple is a Parihara sthalam for Naga Dosham and Rahu Kethu Pariharam

History

The Temple is believed to be built by later Cholas in the 12th Century and later renovated by Haysalas and Vijayanagara Kings, inscriptions available in this temple records these facts.

Presiding deity is called as Nageswarar and Mother is called as Samayavalli Thayar. There are Shrines for Nithya Vinayagar, Lord Ayyapan, Naalvar, Palani Andavar, Lord Muruga with his consorts Valli and Deivanai, Natarajar Shaba, 63 Nayanmars, Radha Krishnan, Guru Bhagavan and Naga Statues.

There is a separate Shrine for kala Bhairavar called Ashtanga Bhairavar can be seen in the temple. He is without his dog Vahana. Sthala Vriksham is Vilva Tree.

Temple Opening Time

The Temple remains open from 6.30 AM to 12 Noon and 5.30 PM TO 9.00 P.M.

Connectivity

Ambur is located at about 52 Kms from Vellore, 28 Kms from Gudiyatham, 18 kms from Vaniyambadi, 38 kms from Thirupattur, 44 kms from Yelagiri, 30 kms from pallikonda and 188 kms from Chennai Nageswarar Temple is located at about 1.5 kms from Ambur Bus Stand, 1.2 kms from Ambur Railway Station and 177 from Chennai International Airports.
