ORDER:

The Ministry of Finance, Government of India in its release order third read above, among others, have sanctioned and released a sum of Rs.116,50,00,000/- (Rupees One hundred and Sixteen crore and fifty lakh only) as grants to Million Plus Cities of the State of Tamil Nadu for improving ambient air quality for the year 2020-2021 as recommended by 15th Central Finance Commission.

2. The Ministry of Finance, Government of India while releasing the Grant has stated that the States while allocating grants to Urban Local Bodies in Million-Plus urban agglomerations/cities should also make allotment of grants on population basis for the Cantonment Boards (if any) within their territorial jurisdiction of any Million-Plus urban agglomerations/cities as per the list at Annexure 5.4 of the Finance Commission-XV Report for the year 2020-2021.

- **3.** Further, the Ministry of Finance, Government of India has stated that the Urban agglomerations which contain more than one Million-Plus city, the concerned State Government, in consultation with all such entities within the urban agglomeration, shall entrust one urban local body as a nodal entity to receive the grants. This nodal entity shall also have the responsibility of achieving the performance indicators for the entire urban agglomeration. Finance Commission-XV recommended above mentioned grant (1st installment) for Million-Plus cities is intended to be utilized for air quality improvement measures, including capacity building of the local bodies within the Million-Plus city/agglomeration, as well as meeting the additional needs of State Pollution Control Boards to appropriately assist the local bodies in monitoring the ambient air quality.
- 4. Accordingly, the Government accord sanction and release a sum of Rs.116,50,00,000/- (Rupees One hundred and Sixteen crore and fifty lakh only) as the first installment of Grant for the year 2020-2021 under the award of 15th Central Finance Commission to Million Plus Cities (i.e) Greater Chennai Corporation, Madurai and Tiruchirappalli Municipal Corporations as detailed below:-

- **6.** The Commissioner of Municipal Administration is authorized to draw the amount sanctioned in para 4 above and disburse to the concerned Municipal Corporations.
- 7. The Commissioner of Municipal Administration is requested to follow the Operational Guidelines issued by the Ministry of Finance in the letter second read above and guidelines issued by the Ministry of

Environment, Forest and Climate Change(MOEF&CC) from time to time and recommendations/parameters fixed by the Finance Commission-XV in Annexure-5.5 of its Report for the year 2020-2021. The Greater Chennai Corporation, Madurai and Tiruchirappalli Municipal Corporations should meet the norms/targets individually.

- **8.** The Commissioner of Municipal Administration is requested to furnish necessary Utilization Certificate towards the Utilization of funds sanctioned at para 4 above in the prescribed format for forwarding the same to the Government of India, immediately.



Operational Guidelines for the implementation of the recommendations on Urban Local body grants contained in Chapter 5(Local Body Grants) of the Fifteenth Finance Commission (FC-XV) Report.

Introduction

- 1. The Fifteenth Finance Commission (FC-XV) was constituted by the President on November 27th, 2017 and was, inter-alia, mandated to recommend measures needed to augment the Consolidated Funds of the States to supplement the resources of the Panchayats and Municipalities during 2020-25. Subsequently, the Commission was mandated to submit two reports, one for the year 2020-21 and the final Report for the period 2021-22 to 2025-26. The Commission submitted its first Report covering the financial year 2020-21 to the President on 5th December, 2019.
- 2. The Union Government on 31-01-2020 vide Explanatory Memorandum as to the Action Taken on the Recommendations made by the Fifteenth Finance Commission in its Report for the year 2020-21 inter-alia accepted the recommendations of the FC-XV in respect of the Local Bodies.

Grants recommended

3. The FC-XV have worked out a total size of the grant for local bodies amounting to Rs. 90,000 crore for twenty-eight States. Out of this corpus, the Commission have recommended allocation of Rs. 29,250 crore for Urban Local bodies in 2020-21. The Commission have divided the urban local bodies into two categories: (a) fifty Million-Plus urban agglomerations/cities, excluding Delhi and Srinagar, and (b) all other cities and towns with less than one million population. The Commission (FC-XV) have recommend Rs. 9,229 crore for the Million-Plus cities comprising of Rs. 4400 crore allocated for Ambient Air quality and Rs. 4829 crore for Solid Waste Management & Sanitation. For all other cities and towns, the Commission (FC-XV) have recommend Rs. 20,021 crore, 50% of which will be basic (untied) and the remaining 50% as tied grant. State-wise allocation of Urban Local body grant is given in Annexure-I, attached.

Distribution of ULB grants by the States

- 4. Million-Plus urban agglomerations/cities:- Urban agglomerations which contain more than one Million-Plus cities, the concerned State Government, in consultation with all such entities within the urban agglomeration, shall entrust one urban local body as a nodal entity to receive the grants. This nodal entity will also have the responsibility of achieving the performance indicators for the entire urban agglomeration.
- 5. All other cities and towns:- For urban local bodies other than Million-Plus cities, the grants should be distributed to each urban local body on the basis of accepted recommendations of the latest State Finance Commission (SFC) suitably modified to accommodate the Cantonment Boards. In case of non-availability of SFC recommendation for distribution within a particular category, the allocations should be on the basis of population and area in the ratio of 90:10.
- The States should also make allotment of grants on population basis for the Cantonment Boards within their territories. The list of fifty-nine Cantonment Boards in seventeen States along with the population is at Annexure-II, attached.

Note:- wherever population is to be used, figures as reported in the population Census of 2011 will be used.)

Modalities for the release of grant

7. For Million-Plus urban agglomerations/cities:-

- (i) Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) as the nodal ministry shall, in consultation with the State Governments, to develop eity-wise and year-wise targets on ambient air quality targets for 2020-25 based on annual average concentrations of PM10 and PM2.5, monitor and evaluate the improvement and recommend disbursal of grants to such cities in two equal instalments. The second instalment shall be disbursed against the stipulated performance-based outcomes in terms of year-on-year improvement in air quality in January 2021 (Annex 5.5). The MoEF&CC shall publish the benchmarks as immediately as possible and recommend release of grant(Rs. Rs. 4400 erore earmarked for the year 2020-21 for Ambient Air quality) as per the instructions contained in para xiii and xiv of Chapter 5 of FC-XV Report. In case of non-achievement of improvement targets by cities, the balance undistributed fund will be distributed as per the procedure laid down by the FC-XV in para viv of FC-XV Report.
 - (ii) Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), as the nodal ministry, shall, in consultation with the State Governments, develop city-wise and year-

wise targets for 2020-25 strictly as per the parameters laid down by FC-XV in Annexure 5.6 and recommend disbursal of Solid Waste Management grant to such cities in two equal instalments. The targets will be improvements over the base year. In 2020-21, the States need to draw up a detailed project report for capacity development and address the infrastructural issues for meeting the service level benchmarks (as per details at Annex 5.6 of FC-XV Report). For the year 2020-21, the recommended amount of Rs. 4,829 erore will be disbursed to concerned cities without any condition and amount released needs to be spend exclusively for improving water and solid waste management and achieving of star ratings by the urban local bodies. Subsequent instalments will be released on the recommendation of the MoHUA based on the assessment about achievement of specified targets.

(iii) The States need to submit detailed utilization Reports to the nodal ministries clearly indicating the items on which expenditure has been incurred in consonance with the stipulated targets and achievements.

For Non-Million-Plus cities

- 8. For urban local bodies other than in Million-Plus cities:-
- 50% of Rs. 20021 crore will be released as basic grant(untied) and the remaining 50% will be released as field grant in two equal instalments. While basic grants can be utilized for location specific needs except for salary and establishment expenses, tied grants are to be utilized for (a) drinking water (including rainwater harvesting and recycling) and (b) solid waste management (as per details at Annex 5.6 of FC-XV Report). These urban local bodies shall earmark one half of the tied grants each to these two critical services and this amount will be in addition to the funds received from any other source/schemes from Union/State. However, if any local body has fully saturated the needs of one category, it can utilise the funds for the other category. Subsequent instalment(s) of tied grants will be released on the recommendations of the MoHUA based on the assessment about achievement of specified targets.

Utilisation of grants

9. The States need to submit detailed utilization Reports (for Million plus cities and other than Million plus cities) to the nodal ministries clearly indicating the items on which expenditure has been incurred in consonance with the stipulated targets and achievements along with the Utilisation Certificate on format as prescribed at

Annexure-III, attached and also make these details available on the website dedicated for the purpose.

Monitoring and concurrent evaluation

 Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs. Govt. of India shall also monitor the implementation of the remaining recommendations of the FC-XV with regard to ULBs.

Allocation of ULBs grant for the remaining years of the award period

11. State-wise Allocation for the remaining years of the award period will be intimated to all the States in due course of time.

According to the MolF&CC, ambient air quality is not a major problem in eight urban applomerations with a million plus population, namely. Kannur, Kochi, Kollam, Kozhikode, Malappuram, Thiruvananthapuram, and Thrissur it Kerala and Coimbatore in Tamil Nadu, With these cities way below the NAMP threshold for breaching pollution by particulate matter, their total grants will be linked to service-level benchmarks on solid waste management-star rating, drinking water, water recycling and rainwater harvesting.
